

# **MINUTES OF THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE**

**OCTOBER 7, 2008 - 7:00 PM  
Main Assembly Room, City-County Building  
400 Main Street, Knoxville, Tennessee**

## **1. CALL TO ORDER**

The Council of the City of Knoxville met in Regular Session at 7:00 p.m. in the Main Assembly Room of the City-County Building on Tuesday, October 7, 2008. Mayor Bill Haslam was present and presiding officer of the Council.

- 12-b.** An Ordinance to amend the Knoxville City Code, Appendix B, “Zoning Regulations”, Article II and Article IV, Sections 2.G., 2a.G., 2b.F., and 2c.G., to restrict parking in front yards in R-1, R-1A, R-1E, and R-1EN zoning districts. (MPC Approved 12-0-1) (File No. 2-C-08-OA)

Discussion began with the following persons addressing the ordinance: Terry Faulkner, 4178 Ridgeway Lane, in favor of ordinance; Jim Bletner, 3819 Glenfield Drive, in favor of ordinance; John Hatton, 2315 Monterrey Drive, opposed to ordinance; Ken Weaver, 4310 Ellen Street, opposed to ordinance; Councilmember Frost; Police Chief Roehl; Councilmember Becker.

Councilmember Becker stated that he would like to have a workshop on this issue and postpone what is on the agenda tonight, but he was not making a motion.

Councilmember Hall stated that he would prefer sending the matter straight back to MPC because he had a problem voting on something on first reading that is not complete.

Councilmember Hultquist, Councilmember Hall, Councilmember Pelot, Councilmember Becker and Attorney Charles Swanson addressed the ordinance.

Councilmember Becker made a motion to postpone the ordinance four (4) weeks. Councilmember Hall seconded the motion.

Vice-Mayor Brown, Councilmember Pelot, Councilmember Becker and Councilmember Hall continued the discussion.

Councilmember Becker withdrew his motion to postpone. Councilmember Hall withdrew his second to the motion.

Councilmember Frost: I received in the mail like all members of city council, a copy of the work product of the groups that worked innumerable hours, which I'm greatly appreciative of. I've read it, I've certainly considered it. I would like to make that a part of the record for this item and I would like to move to amend the item before us to include the work product of the committee.

Vice-Mayor Brown seconded Councilman Frost's motion.

Councilmember Pelot and Vice-Mayor Brown continued the discussion.

Vice-Mayor Brown called for the question.

By unanimous voice vote, Councilman Frost's motion as stated above was approved.

Vice-Mayor Brown: I make a motion to refer this item back to MPC and request that City Council conduct a workshop on the same issue. Councilmember Pelot seconded the motion. By unanimous voice vote the motion carried. The item was referred back to MPC and a workshop will be scheduled.
