Precious metal clay (PMC) is a putty-like mix of silver powder, water, and binder that makes it possible for students to make real metal jewelry in a matter of

hours. It can be molded and worked to make all kinds of jewelry, then dried and fired. When the water and binder are fired off, it leaves a 99.9% pure silver piece. A variety of techniques will be demonstrated to illustrate how to make pendants, earrings and other jewelry. You will only be limited by your imagination.
